REPORT - 2021-22**

On **26<sup>th</sup> January 2022** Republic Day was Celebrated by Vidyavardhaka Education Institution at Bayalu Rangamandhira, Vidyavardhaka Education Society Premises..



The Programme began with Flag hoisting at 7.30am by Chief Guest Sri. Ramesh (Ramani) Corporator, Mysuru City Corporation, Mysuru. Dr. Srinivas Assistant Professor of Kannada Vidyavardhaka First Grade College, welcomed the guest and gathering. The chief guest in his speech pointed out that on January 26, 1950, the Indian Constitution came into effect. The Constituent Assembly, meant to draft the Constitution of India, held its first session on December 9, 1946. The last assembly session ended on November 26, 1949, and then the

Constitution was adopted a year later. Republic Day commemorates the spirit of independent and individual India. It was on this day in 1930 when the Indian National Congress proclaimed Purna Swaraj, the declaration of India's independence from colonial rule. The day also commemorates Indian citizens' power to choose their government democratically. The nation celebrates this day as the national holiday for the establishment of the Indian Constitution.



Chief Guest Sri. Shivalingaiah, Member Vidyavardhaka Education Society® in his speech he pointed out the duties of a teacher which is to be true to their profession and since they play a real role in a student's life and for his success they should be a model to their students. This begins as to how we take our teaching profession and how punctual we are. Students learn through their teachers and only few are remembered for ever not all. Every one of us remembers a teacher from our primary school and this is because they have left their impression of being good in our minds. We try to imitate them and behave like them. This programme was presided over by Sri. Shrishyalaramanavar, Hon'ble Treasure Vidyavardhaka Sangha ®, Mysuru. In his presidential address he said after 200 years of British rule, when India gained Independence from the United Kingdom on August 15, 1947, it did not have a permanent constitution of its own. It was felt that a written constitution would help to run the country more systematically and for that, a drafting committee was constituted, headed by Dr B.R. Ambedkar. It took almost 2 years, 11 months and 18 days for the committee to draft the constitution. After making all the necessary changes it was formally adopted on November 26,

1949, by the Constituent Assembly of India. However, it came into force on January 26, 1950, and since that day India started celebrating January 26 as Republic Day.

Concluding the programme, vote of thanks was delivered by Smt. Indumathi M J Assistant Professor of Law, Vidyavardhaka Law College, Mysuru.
