

BRIEF REPORT ON WORLD DRUG DAY-2024

On 26th June 2024 World Drug Day was celebrated. Sri. Lokesh C V, Assistant Sub Inspector, Mysore Railway Police Station, Mysuru as the Chief Guest and Women Constable also accompany with resource person. The world drug day theme 2024 is "The Evidence is Clear: Invest in Prevention." The chief guest pointed out that, the global drug problem presents a multifaceted challenge that touches the lives of millions worldwide. Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan (NMBA)

NMBA was launched on 15th August, 2020, by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment in 272 identified most vulnerable districts. It has now been extended to all districts across the country.

Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan intends to reach out to the masses and spread awareness about substance use with focus on higher educational Institutions, university campuses & schools. It further aims to reach out dependent population with the focus on counselling, treatment facilities in hospitals, rehabilitation centres, and capacity building programmes for service providers.



Till now, through the various activities undertaken on- ground, more than 10.73 crore people have been sensitized on substance use including over 3.39 crore youth and 2.27 crore women. Participation of 3.29+ lakh educational institutions has ensured that the message of the Abhiyaan reaches children and youth of the country. A strong force of 8,000+ Master Volunteers (MVs) have been identified and trained to expand the reach of the program.
