**Report on Celebration of Kannada Rajyotsava**  
**On 28-10-2021**

Rajyotsava (meaning 'state festival') commemorates this day in 1956 when the state of Karnataka was created by merging all the Kannada language-speaking regions of south India. Following India becoming a republic in 1950, different provinces were created based on the languages spoken in a particular region. On November 1st 1956, several of these merged to form the state of Mysore, which was the name of an older region that formed part of the new state. This name was not a popular choice with some northern parts of the state, so eventually, on November 1st 1973, the state was renamed Karnataka, from the Kannada word 'Karunadu' meaning "lofty land".

On 28-10-2021 based on the order passed by the Government of Karnataka in our college we celebrate Kannada Rajyotsava. On 28<sup>th</sup> October, around five-lakh people from across the world sang Kannada songs which were written by three poets. Arrangements were made for everyone to sing in unison and the state government directed all the DCs and CEOs to make proper arrangements.



In Karnataka, the foundation day is called Karnataka Rajyotsava Day, and the state's official red and yellow flags adorn the streets, houses and official buildings to celebrate the foundation of the state. The day also marks the annual presentation of the Rajyotsava Awards which is the second-highest civilian honour in the state.



In our college, students, Faculty members, and Non-faculty members were participated in the program to sing the three songs which were written by three poets.

Students actively participated in the programme and sang three songs based on the theme “Laksha kanta gayana”



After singing the songs we also took an Oath with respect to the importance of Kannada in our system.
