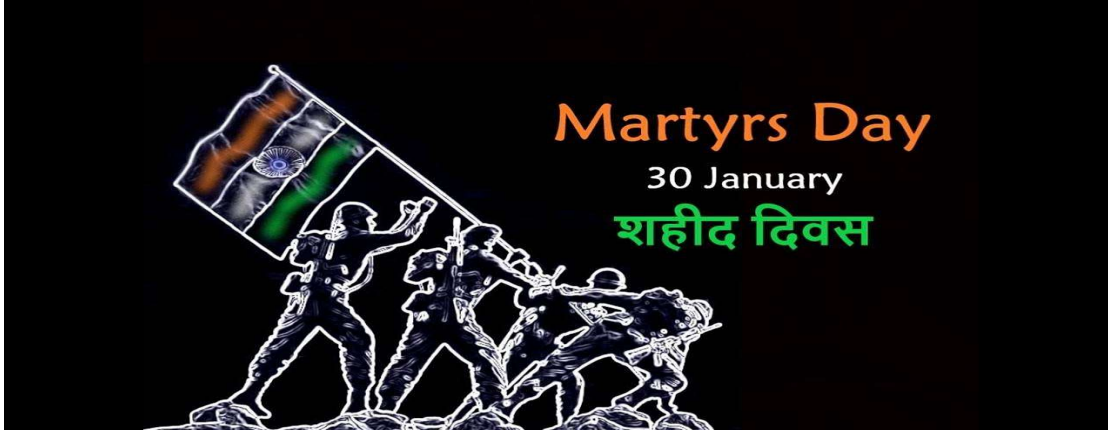

REPORT ON CELEBRATION OF MARTYR'S DAY
2022

On 30th January 2022 Martyr's Day was celebrated at Room No. 5. Dr. Vani Shree N, Flying Officer 2/4 Kar Air Sqn NCC, JSS Law College (Autonomous), Mysuru was invited as guest speaker in this occasion. Addressing the students she spoke about importance of celebrating this day. Firstly, Martyrs' Day is recognised nationally on the 30 January to mark the assassination of Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi in 1948, by Nathuram Godse. Even Bhagat Singh and Sukhdev Thapar were 23 years old while Shivram Rajguru was just 22 years old when they were hanged. Their sacrifice had inspired many other young people to come forward and fight for their motherland.

Secondly, it is a day to honour recognised martyrs of our nation who sacrificed their lives in the battle field. Specifying the meaning of Martyr, she said a martyr is a person who sacrifices for his religion and faith and he can also be a person who sacrifices his life for the nation.

Further she said that Martyrs' Day is also celebrated on 19 May, 21 October, 17 November, and 24 November, for various reasons in India. She advised students to serve the nation whenever they get chance. For this one needs to bring change within. Instead of blaming the system and the government we have to change our self. The change begins within our family. We have to respect our elders and develop the same attitude within our children. Youngsters should gather to talk about our Indian culture with others and praise it. Protection of our national monument is our fundamental duty. At the same time we have to praise the history of presence of these monuments in India. Youngsters should respect the scarifies made by the freedom fighters and be inspired by them. Protecting the safety, security and the respect of our country is in our hands. Soldiers die in the battle field; they sacrifice their life not for their family but for us. We should understand this and respect them.
