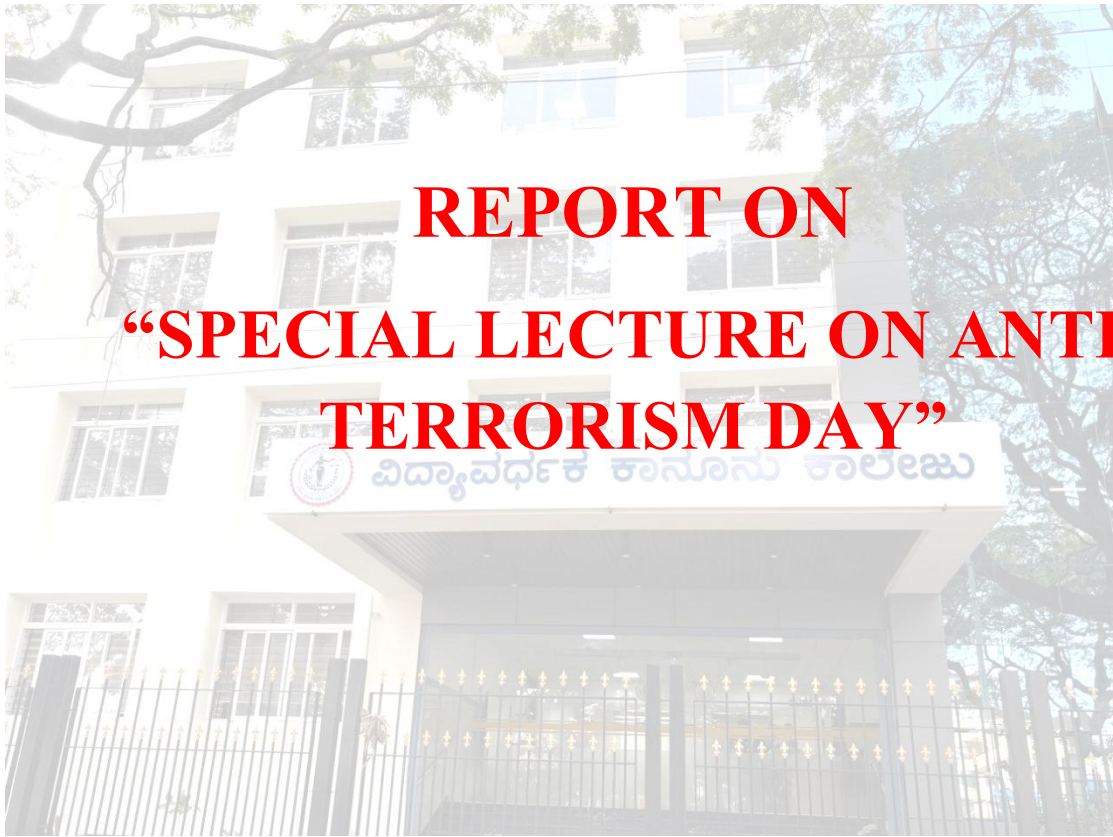

Anti-Terrorism Day

On 24th May 2025, our institution solemnly observed **Anti-Terrorism Day** with the aim of promoting peace, unity, and national integrity.



The day serves as a reminder of the devastating impact of terrorism on innocent lives and the importance of standing united against such threats. The event was **inaugurated by the in-charge principal, Mr. H. S. Shivakumar**, whose inspirational words set the tone for the day's proceedings.

The event began promptly at 11:00 AM in the class room 203, which was filled with students, faculty, and staff. The in-charge principal, **Mr. H. S. Shivakumar**, addressed the gathering with a powerful speech emphasizing the importance of awareness, vigilance, and unity in combating terrorism.



He highlighted how terrorism is not just an attack on individuals, but on the very foundation of peace, freedom, and democracy. Mr. Shivakumar urged the youth to be informed and responsible citizens who reject violence and promote communal harmony.

Documentary Screening

A major highlight of the event was the screening of the powerful documentary **“Inside Mumbai’s Worst Jihadist Attacks | ENDEVIR Documentary.”** The film provided a harrowing and in-depth look into the 2008 Mumbai attacks, one of the deadliest terrorist incidents in Indian history. The documentary traced the events of November 26, 2008, when ten heavily armed terrorists from Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba launched coordinated attacks across Mumbai. Over a span of four days, these terrorists targeted prominent locations such as the **Taj Mahal Palace Hotel, Leopold Café, Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus (CSMT), Oberoi Trident Hotel, and Nariman House**, killing 166 people and injuring hundreds more. The film combined real CCTV footage, survivor testimonies, intelligence debriefs, and news broadcasts from the time, offering an unflinching look into how the events unfolded and how security forces responded. The documentary effectively conveyed the terror, confusion, and trauma experienced during those 47 minutes.
