Legal ethics is an exceptionally important aspect of the practice of law, and by discussing the meaning of legal ethics, this essay shall demonstrate the importance to the best interest of the public. The words do not have a precise definition mainly due to the subjectivity of what is 'right' and 'wrong', but it can be boiled down to a system of moral and ethical principles and rules of conduct applied to the practice of law. In other professions, as well as the public, law is held to a higher standard of conduct and therefore lawyers are implied to be more morally upstanding than the average citizen. This is due to their implied ability to understand and manipulate the law. The rules and regulations that are set in place for legal professionals vary from country to country, and state to state, however generally it is a lawyer's duty to act in the best interest of the administration of justice. This means that unless there is a reasonable excuse, lawyers are duty-bound to do what is right, even if right is not necessarily in their client's best interests. An example of this is where a lawyer must disclose information to the authorities if it will prevent harm being done to another, even though this breaches the duty of confidentiality to the client. Failure to abide by the rules can result in several sanctions being taken against the lawyer, essentially preventing them from practicing law. These can result in punishments, the most severe being disbarment, or simply a tarnished reputation.
