Report of Programme of Mahaparinirvan Diwas-2024

Ambedkar and also organised special lecture programme to give awareness to students about objectives and importance of Mahaparinirvan Divas-2024 which held on 06-12-2024 at room no 3. Principal and other faculties and the students. Sri. Paramananda, while addressing the students, informed the importance of the Mahaparinirvan Divas. Mahaparinirvan Diwas has been observed on every 6th of December to mark the death anniversary of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, prominent leader, a jurist, social reformer, politician, Chairman of Drafting Committee and who worked tirelessly to ensure justice, equality and dignity for all citizens and also known as father of Indian Constitution and played crucial role in shaping modern India.

They further informed that, Babasaheb Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, by rejecting religious and caste based inequalities embraced the Buddhism on October 16 1956 and he is the guiding figure for the Buddhist movement of independence India and inspired the millions to fight for equality. In less than two months after converting to Buddhism they passed away on December 6, 1956. According to Buddhist text Mahaparinirvana Sutta, Mahaparinirvana Means death of Lord Buddha at the age of 80 is regarded as the initial Mahaparinirvana it means the state of Parinirvana as it denotes person who attained nirvana or freedom both during their life and after passes away. Achieving nirvana after death or the liberation of the soul from the body after death is referred as Parinirvana. The India's highest civilian honor, the Bharat Rtana was posthumously given to Babasaheb Dr. B. R. Ambedkar for his significant contribution to the nation. Dr. Deepu. P., Principal, while addressing students, explained the contributions of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar for the empowerment of vulnerable sections especially women and children etc., and also emphasised the various constitutional provisions in empowerment of women.
